Micah Luce has renewed his solo privileges after a year's hiatus – congrats again, Micah!

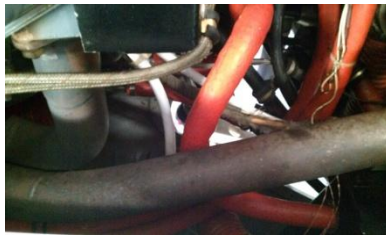
And last but not least: **Tom Sobocinski** has finally completed his first solo cross-country after a year (nearly?) trying. Congratulations – what a nice day it was today!!!
